- 2. Objectives of the Practice:
 - · To promote reading culture among Pupil Teachers.
 - To develop love for literature among Pupil Teachers.
 - To promote innovative and creative art of writing among Pupil Teachers
 - · To broaden the vocabulary bank of pupil teachers
- 3. The Context of the Practice:

With the increasing use of technology, pupil teachers have become more inclined to get readymade solutions. They have no patience to sit in the library, read books and enjoy literature. We at B.C.M College formed 'Book Lovers Club' to inculcate reading habits among pupil teachers. A session was organised to orient pupil teachers about Book Lovers Club of the college, its objectives and activities to be organised during the session 2021-2022. The pupil teachers were motivated to acquire reading competence for successful functioning as future teachers in the contemporary world.

4. The Practice:

As per the proposed Plan, activities were organised to develop the flavour of reading during the session 2021-22.

On 16 December, 2021 it was announced in the morning assembly that every student will
start reading a book, write its review and submit it to the concerned tutorial in charge.

Students were given the opportunity to read the review in their respective tutorials. An activity was organised tutorial -wise and tutorial in charges submitted the list of book reviews on January 7, 2022.

- On 18 December 2021, students visited library to note new arrivals in the library and came to know about the latest books related to their compulsory and pedagogy subjects.
- On 24 December 2021, a session was organised for pupil teachers on "How to read?" by Dr. Jasdeep Kaur, Assistant Prof. of the college. She elucidated on intensive and extensive reading and made some model representation of Reading Aloud.
- House wise Activity on reading aloud was organised from 22 March-2 April. The
 students read an unseen comprehension with appropriate stimulus variation, punctuation,
 stress and intonation etc. After reading inference questions were asked to make one a
 better reader. Intra house reading aloud was held on 5th and 6th April, 2022.
- Inter house competition was organised on 12th April 2022.
- On 23rd April, 2022 World Book Day was celebrated under the mentorship of tutorial in charges to mark the death anniversary of William Shakespeare. Students shared poems and highlighted the importance of the day.
- To improve vocabulary bank of students, one of the pupil teachers came up with 10 new vocabulary words and their usage during morning assembly. This practice of adding new words in the existing vocabulary of pupil teachers continued during the session.

5. Evidence of Success:

It was observed that each and every student read at least one or two new books, learnt many new words and started reading fluently during the course of action planned for the session. Students started writing their ideas in innovative manner for publication in the college magazine and daily newspapers. Some of the students developed critical and analytical skills as it was clearly evident during tutorial-wise book review sessions.

6. Problems Encountered & Resources required

We started the club with an intention of developing reading habits amongst pupil teachers and found that students were much affected by the environment which was not inclined towards reading. Neither parents nor teachers stressed on developing reading habits among their children.

6. Problems Encountered & Resources Required:


