5. Evidence of Success:

To Study opinion of Pupil Teachers about Skill Development Programme & to realise the project objectives, a self prepared Feedback Performa comprising of 35 items (7 each for the Five Focus Areas of Skill Development Programme) was prepared. Focus Area Wise Distribution of Items of The Feedback Performa has been given below:

Administration of Feedback Performa

The Feedback Performa was administered to a total sample of 250 B.Ed. Teacher Trainees using Lark Software Application, the official Digital Learning App of the college. (Annexure)

Scoring

Self-Prepared Feedback Performa in the form of Opinionnaire was a 3 point scale. Scoring was done on the following basis-

- · 3 marks for Agree
- · 2 for Neutral
- 1 for Disagree
- (i) Analysis And Interpretation On Analysis of scores on Self-Prepared Feedback Performa, the Focus Area Wise Results are as below:-
- (ii) 88% of the Pupil Teachers agreed that Skill Development Programme was extremely helpful in sharpening their Communication & Employability Skills.
- (iii) 9% of the Pupil Teachers had a neutral opinion regarding the significance of Skill Development Programme in sharpening their Communication & Employability Skills.
- (iv) 81% of the Pupil Teachers agreed that Skill Development Programme was very beneficial in honing their Life Skills.
- (v) 15% of the Pupil Teachers were neutral about the role of Skill Development Programme in chiseling their Life Skills.
- (vi) 86% of the Pupil Teachers agreed that Skill Development Programme aided them in reviewing content of their respective subject area.
- (vii) 11% of the Pupil Teachers had a neutral view about the worth of Skill Development Programme in reviewing content.
- (viii) 85% of the Pupil Teachers agreed that Skill Development Programme helped them in enhancing their Pedagogical Knowledge & Skills.
- (ix) 14% of the Pupil Teachers were neutral about the impact of Skill Development Programme on their Teaching Knowledge & Skills.
- (x) 83% of the Pupil Teachers agreed that Skill Development Programme was exceptionally useful in developing their Technological Skills.
- (xi) 14% of the Pupil Teachers had a neutral opinion about Skill Development Programme in sharpening their Technological Skills.

6. Problems Encountered & Resources required

 Basic English Grammar knowledge of the pupil teachers was very superficial that delayed acquisition of Communication Skills.

- COVID-19 outbreak resulted in unavailability of students, faculty and paucity of time.
- Managing periods in the timetable for reviewing the Content Knowledge of Pupil teachers was challenging.
- Negligible Technological Knowledge and Skills of Pupil Teachers made data collection (filling of Feedback Performa) via Lark App difficult.

- 3. The Context of the Practice

COVID19 has ushered in a time of change and forced paradigm shifts in many areas. It has forced us to rethink the traditional school model and question the way we teach. Things have started to look different, however, in the wake of the current, novel coronavirus COVID-19 pandemic, since the entire world is under lockdown. It is the time of the year when academic and teaching activities are in full swing in most parts of the world. The current pandemic situation has paved the way for a ground test of virtual classrooms as a prominent tool of learning in the current times. At this prevailing situation of virtual teaching and setting of new normal of teaching-learning methodology, it becomes all more important to get to know the Impact of Virtual Classes.

4. The Practice of the Practice

- The researcher used quantitative methodology to study the Impact of Virtual Classes on Pre-Service Teachers during Covid-19 during the lockdown period.
- A self-made questionnaire was used to collect data through a google form links
 which was shared with Education Colleges of Punjab. Apart from basic
 information of Pre-Service Teachers, questions related to Academic Aspects, ICT
 Skills, Evaluation Process, Emotional Development, Health Issues and Support
 Systems were asked.

5. Evidence of Success

Results of the research showed that Pre-Service Teachers have adopted Virtual Classes whole heartedly. They have realized that during this situation of Pandemic, Virtual Classes are the only option. However, they missed the physical classroom interaction and their peer interaction. We all know that Pre-Service Teachers training course is the professional course, which requires physical practice of various teaching skills that lacked during Virtual Classes. Despite of all perfections in Virtual Classes, they cannot replace traditional classroom teaching.

6. Problems Encountered and Resources Required:

No major obstacles were faced during research. The only obstacle was the collection of responses from the sample. The reason was that responses were collected online while some of the pre-service teachers were reluctant to fill the google form. Electric gadget, Internet facility and data analysis app.
